Knowing where a prisoner is held, and for how long can offer a much-needed sense of security, especially for victims of violent crimes.

An especially useful feature of the inmate locator is the visitation information. Jail listings include visiting hours, in addition to rules and regulations governing visitation at various facilities. You won't have to worry about being turned away for not meeting facility guidelines. The locator also has a built in calculator that displays how much good time credit a prisoner has for the time served.

After experiencing the twists and turns of the penal system first hand, the site's creator has written a book for prisoners and their families. The book, "How to Survive in Jail or Prison: How not to be a Victim," details events and what to expect during one of the most traumatic life events for you and your family.

The publication is available for download from the JailGuide website and chronicles the entire process from the initial arrest to actually going to jail. There's also advice on how to survive jail time and how to proceed when you're released, paroled or on probation. It's important to understand the legal system.
